What will I learn on this course?

Learners will:

- 1. Understand lens compression and flash photography and demonstrate this in at least 1 image / set up
- 2. Experiment with creating abstract still life in at least 1 image.
- 3. Take at least 1 portrait image using advance studio lighting techniques

You will work on creating a short portfolio of photos to be presented during the end of the course and will have one location project.

Is this course suitable for me?

Is there anything else I need to know about the course?

Please bring to the first session:

- Preferably a digital SLR camera (the course may be suitable for those with compact digital cameras, however, they must have manual exposure controls and a lens with an optical zoom covering wide -angle to telephoto focal lengths.
- Tripod
- Different lenses
- Note pad

Some of your guided learning hours will be used to set the group and individual learning targets for the course. You will receive feedback from your Tutor to enable you to fully develop and progress.
