What will I learn on this course?

Learners will:

1. Demonstrate neat casting and casting off for at least one project or sample.
2. demonstrate increasing stitches on at least one project
3. use a pattern and be able to create at least one item or sample using the pattern

Is this course suitable for me?

For beginners and improvers, ideally for those who have completed course 1/2 but new learners may join this course.

Is there anything I need to know about the course?

Learners will need yarn and needles or crochet hook, but your tutor will advise you on this during your first session.

You will also need:

- Size 4mm crochet hook
- Size 4mm knitting needles
- ape measure,
- notebook and pen,
- small scissors or snips

What could I go on to do after this course?
