Sashiko is a traditional Japanese hand-stitching technique suitable for all abilities which aims to decorate, strengthen and repair existing fabrics. We will use indigo dyed cloth to replicate that of historical Japan and create samplers of the various patterns which can be used for a further project.

What Will I Learn On This Course?

1. Use division to design at least 1 grid system
2. Use addition to allow the correct seam allowances on at least 1 item and subtraction to design at least 1 pattern with pleasing regularity
3. Keep a wellbeing diary of at least 3 entries to plot your progress and impact of the course

Learners will also:

- Count stitches accurately to achieve a regular design in the stitching.
- Use literacy skills to read patterns.
- Use and apply literacy skills to journal and create diary entries
