1. Learn the basics of threading and tension adjustments and demonstrate on at least one item/ sample
2. Learn how to set up and take down the machine, demonstrate this on at least 2 occasions.
3. Practice different sewing techniques with an overlocker and produce an item or samples to demonstrate.

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A basic sewing kit including dressmaking scissors, un-picker, tape measure, notebook or folder, small scissors or snips, some sewing threads etc.

You WILL need some scraps of fabric to practice techniques on, an old (CLEAN) sheet or duvet cover is a very economical way to gain lots of practice fabric.

Will There Be Additional Costs?

You will need to buy some fabric – but please wait until after the first week of the course so that we can discuss what you need
